



ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THREE YEAR DEGREE COURSE AND TWO YEARS PG COURSE

BA., B.Sc. and B.Com

Part - I: The candidates should have passed PUC II year from Karnataka P.U.E. Board or any equivalent recognized by the affiliating University

Part – II: The candidates should have studied the BA., B.Sc and B.Com part –I class of the Rani Channamma University, Belagavi keeping academic terms to a minimum of 75 % attendance, with good conduct.

Part – III: The candidates should have studied BA., B.Sc and B.Com part –II class of the Rani Channamma University, Belagavi keeping academic terms to a minimum of 75 % attendance, with good conduct.

Since there is a provision for improvement of academic qualifications re-admission to any classes is not allowed. Transfer of the students from one college to another college outside chikodi will be done only with the NOC of the both the colleges as well as the permission of the affiliating University, provided the same combination of the subjects should be available in both the colleges. But under any circumstances transfer will not be made from one college to another college in the same city.

Each subject combination has a definite intake capacity. The principal has every right to stop, continue or restrict the number of students for a specific combination. Students may be asked to offer the prevailing combination. The eligibility condition for above mentioned various classes are subjected to variation as per the latest rules and regulations of Govt. of Karnataka, Rani Channamma University, Belagavi and the institution as the case may be.

- To make wide ranging social contribution to close association with the students, teaching staff, administrative staff, housekeeping staff by disclosing environmental information and supporting environmental consumption




ANTI HARASSMENT CELL FOR WOMEN

The NSS camps are organised during the mid-term vacation.


The student enrolled in NCC shall attend 80% of the parades conducted during the year. The NSS volunteers shall attend a minimum of 120 service hours during the year






